## PRINCIPAL'S *Corner*

Dear families and friends of our school

**Sick Children:** A reminder that we will send any child who is sick or showing cold/flu-like symptoms home. We ask that parents with two or more children attending adopt the **'One Sick, All Sick'** rule during Level Two.

**COVID 19:** Under the school's alert level 2 guidelines the following need to be observed. Parents will not be allowed in the school grounds until Sunday 27th June.

- i. The one sick, all sick rule comes back into effect until Sunday 27th June. If a child is sick between now and Sunday 27th June, you will need to contact your GP and get their advice and/or get a Covid test. Children will not be allowed back to school until these are done.
- ii. No school assembly this week.
- iii. ALL parents coming into the school office must sign in and out for contact tracing purposes.
- iv. No more than 2 adults will be allowed in the school office at one time.

Asbestos removal

This Saturday the builders who are working on the refurbishment of Room's 12 and 1 will be removing small amounts of asbestos from the classrooms. They are experienced in asbestos removal and will be taking all the safety precautions. The asbestos was located internally within the building structure, covered and not exposed, so students who have been in Room's 12 and 1 would not have come into direct contact with it.

**Matariki Celebrations:** We will be holding a whole school Matariki evening on **Thursday 1st July**. Matariki have been working hard to make this evening an event that you do not want to miss! If the weather is clear, we will meet as a whole school on the front court at 5:30pm to open our evening with karakia and waiata. Whānau are then free to head to their child's classroom to share food and be entertained with what your tamariki have prepared. The nights events will end at 7pm. We look forward to sharing this evening with you.
