#### Class sound systems

Up until this week a small number of our classrooms had sound field systems in them. These systems were originally designed to help those students with hearing impairments by focussing the teacher's voice more efficiently and increasing the clarity. Subsequently there has been research carried out that showed that these sound field systems have benefits for all students. As of this week the PTA has funded the installation of sound field systems in all of our remaining classrooms. This has been a substantial investment and will be hugely beneficial for our students and teachers. I would like to thank the PTA for all the hard work they put in so our school can have the best classroom environments possible for our tamariki to learn in.

**Testing** Every year we administer standardised tests in late February and early March. These help us identify areas of strength and weakness and help us to help your child with their future learning. We will be undertaking Progressive Achievement Tests (PATs), for Reading, Vocab and Comprehension. Children in Years 4-8 will be completing these assessments. Whilst we want good, accurate results, we will not be making this a stressful time for your child and we would appreciate your support with this approach. It does not matter how the children perform, we only use these tests as a diagnostic tool to direct future teaching A reminder that if your child is away from school can you please and learning. It is however important that your child is at school for these assessments.
